

ASSISTANT TEACHER (Lower Primary - 6 to 9 years old)

Northfields is seeking to hire an Assistant Teacher in the Lower Primary to work in close collaboration with the teachers and to support the students to be creative.

- ✓ The Assistant Teacher is expected to carry out the professional duties as circumstances may require and in accordance with the school's policies.
- ✓ To be the dynamic link between the children (6 9 years old) and the prepared environment that specifically caters for each child's emotional, spiritual, physical, social and academic developmental needs.
- ✓ To facilitate access to learning for children and to assist the class teachers in the effective development, teaching and management of children and the classroom.
- ✓ To be an effective and collaborative member of the School Team, readily prepared to work positively in a team setting and providing assistance to and co-operating with colleagues, parents and visitors.

The potential candidate will report to the Primary School Principal.

Main duties and responsibilities

Support for all Children

- Through regular observation of the students, to set appropriate yet challenging and demanding
 expectations and promote self-esteem and independence, taking into account the teaching
 objectives, progress and prior attainment of each student;
- To establish a constructive relationship with pupils and interact with them according to individual needs to aid in the acquisition and consolidation of knowledge;
- To promote the inclusion and acceptance of all children;
- To provide the necessary pastoral care and support to enable children to feel secure and happy;
- To provide feedback and positive reinforcement to pupils in relation to progress and achievement under the guidance of the teacher;
- Assist in identifying any particular individual needs and bringing these needs to the attention of the Class Teacher at the earliest possible opportunity.

Support for Children Requiring Learning Support

- To develop a knowledge of a range of learning support needs and to develop an understanding of the specific needs of any pupils to be supported;
- Considering the learning support involved, to aid the children to learn as effectively as possible both in group situations and on his/her own by, for example:
 - o ensuring the child can use equipment and materials provided.
 - o assisting in weaker areas, e.g., language, behaviour, social skills, reading, spelling, handwriting/presentation
 - o helping children to concentrate on and finish work set.
 - o meeting physical needs as required whilst encouraging independence.
 - o developing appropriate resources to support the children.
 - o providing support for individual children inside and outside the classroom to enable them to interact with others and engage in activities led by the teacher.



Support for Teachers

- Assist the Class Teacher/s (and other professionals as appropriate), in the development and planning
 of a programmes for pupils;
- Maintain a neat, well organised and attractive prepared environment consistent with the Montessori Pedagogy and assist in the preparation of class material, furnishing and other resources in a timely manner;
- Promote good behaviour and maintain discipline in accordance with the school's procedures and encouraging good practice with regards to punctuality, behaviour, standards of work (including accuracy and presentation) and homework (where applicable);
- Under the supervision of the Class Teacher, use a variety of teaching methods, in line with the Montessori Philosophy to:
 - o present new key concepts and appropriate vocabulary
 - o use effective questioning, listen carefully to students, positively and respectfully identify mistakes to bring to a child's attention
 - select appropriate learning resources and develop study skills through library, ICT and other sources as appropriate per age;
- Monitor pupils' responses to learning activities and accurately record understanding and achievement as directed;
- Provide detailed and regular feedback about the children's achievement and progress to the teacher and, at the request of the Head of primary, participate in meetings with parents as necessary, as well as formal Parents' Information Evenings;
- Contribute to the maintenance of children's progress records where appropriate;
- Support class teachers in photocopying, preparation of displays of children's work and other class preparation tasks in order to facilitate teaching and learning;

Support for the Curriculum

- Prepare teacher made materials (such as laminated cards) as required by the Class Teacher/s;
- Undertake structured and agreed learning activities/teaching programmes, adjusting activities according to pupil responses;
- Implement intervention programmes linked to learning strategies as prepared by the Class Teacher in collaboration with the Head of primary and SENCO;
- Ensure you are using effective teaching methods and best use of available time.

Other Pastoral and Professional Duties

- Be aware of and regularly evaluate the child's social, physical, spiritual and emotional needs and take action, with the consent of the Class Teacher, if these needs are not being met;
- Always interact with students in a fair, respectful and sensitive way, ensuring a relationship based on non-judgement and trust;
- Establish constructive relationships with parents and carers to foster positive links between home and school and promote a sense of community among parents;
- Encourage children towards self-directed learning, the development of concentration and independence in all aspects of their school life in order to reach their full potential;
- To model desirable behaviour for the children, following the ground-rules of the class, exhibiting a

sense of calm, consistency, grace and courtesy, and teaching students effective conflict resolution techniques;

- Always operate within the stated policies and practices of the school, contributing to the promotion of its mission and values.
- Maintain professional, respectful, positive and effective working relationships with all staff members
 of Northfields International School and, in particular, with other Primary School staff members with
 whom daily interaction is a necessity;
- Set a good example to students and other members of the Northfields community through impeccable presentation, punctuality, reliability and a high level of personal conduct and integrity at all times;
- Ensure a high level of professionalism and confidentiality in all school related matters;
- Be responsible, on a rota basis, for welcoming the students on arrival, supervising play and lunch times, and being on duty at school ending time;
- Be available for afterschool club and aftercare services until 4pm as per the termly, pre-agreed published timetable;
- Attend and participate actively and positively in all pre-arranged staff meetings, planning meeting, inset days, professional development opportunities etc.
- Record and report to the Class teacher all incidents and accidents in line with the school's policies and procedures;
- Be proactive in learning to use and understand the objectives behind the Montessori educational material, in line with the Pedagogy and with the support of colleagues, training and training materials available in class;
- Have a working knowledge of a Primary Teaching Assistant's professional duties and legal liabilities;
- Contribute to the corporate life of the school through effective participation in meetings and management systems necessary to co-ordinate the management of the school if required;
- Contribute fully in school outings and events and take part in marketing and information activities such as Open Days, Information Evenings and other events;
- Take responsibility for own professional development and duties in relation to school policies and practices;
